Barbara was born in Jersey City, NJ She graduated from Long Beach High School in 1942.

After graduation, she moved to Red Bank, NJ where she worked at "Singing Wheels" roller rink. It was there that she met future husband, John "Jack" McLaughlin. They married in 1944, just before Jack left for overseas to serve in the Army during WWII. Barbara worked at Ft. Monmouth during the war and later worked at Camp Coles in Red Bank. They started their family in 1950 while living in Middletown, NJ. They had four children, Janice, Jill, Jean and John. Barbara also was a Girl Scout leader for Fairview troop 126.

The family moved to Houston, TX in 1971, where Barbara worked at the F.A.A. (Bush IAH), and in 1978 was recipient of the "Employee of the Year" award. The following year she received the "Superior Achievement Award". Barbara was also a Eucharistic Minister to the Sick. After retirement, she enjoyed traveling and spending time with friends and family.

She is preceded in death by husband Jack, parents Harry and Genevieve French, sisters Ruth Ford, Lorraine Severin and brothers Robert French and Ed Steffen.

She is survived by her children- Janice Kasten, Jill Allen (James), Jean Konen (Daryl), and John McLaughlin (Kathryn) as well as beloved dog Annie. Also survived by five Grandchildren- Jennifer, Ryan, Zachary, Katy and Sean, ten Great grandchildren -Taylor, Austin, Miranda, Glen, Evan, Hudson, West, Jack, Camden and Caden, and her sister Bernice Turner.
