Harlan Pool Jr. passed away peacefully on the morning of April 28th, 2020 in Houston, Texas. He was born in Mclean, Texas in 1946 to Harlan Sr. and Decie Mae. He was a loving brother to his siblings Carolyn, Barney, Alma and David. Harlan attended Mclean High School and then served in the military where he was stationed in Heidelberg, Germany with the 529th M.P. company. After his service ended he settled back in his beloved home state of Texas and attended college in Temple.

Harlan is preceded in death by his father and mother, older sister Carolyn and brother Barney, nephews Donald and Tommy.

He was determined to climb Mt. Whitney which he did on a number of occasions with his family. During those trips he

was always quick with a joke and a smile about how he “doesn’t do snow” while standing in a pile of it on the mountain. He once took in a stray dog that he said, “he was getting rid of the next day” but kept her day in and day out until she had 6 more puppies. He kept and cared for all of them. The grandkids once sent him a paper cut-out characters called Flat-Stanley. He would take it with him whenever he went on a trip and take a picture of both him and that flat-Stanley together to send to the kids. He was that wonderful.
