



## Ida May Litscher

Ida Chiritree Litscher, born May 22, 1919, passed away Wednesday, September 4th, 2019 in Houston Texas at the age of 100, 4 months

Both Ida and her husband John were born and raised in Shelton, Connecticut and after their marriage lived in Milford and Oxford, Connecticut. Ida studied Dance at a very young age and started her own dancing school when she was still in elementary school. Later she and her future husband performed as a dancing team in the Shelton area and in New York City. Later, as a married couple Ida helped her husband by keeping the books for his home building business. Both were also active in their church, the Oxford United Church of Christ. Ida served as a Deaconess and helped with management of the church budget. Over the years, she had many close friends at church, in town and in her neighborhood. After her husband's retirement, they were enthusiastic RVers, traveling extensively with their RV friends.

At the age of 98, having lived as a widow alone in her own home, Ida decided to move to Texas to be near her son and daughter-in-law. She moved into The Village at Gleannloch Farms in Spring Texas and soon got to know many friends there among the residents and the staff. After a fall, Ida had surgery for a broken bone. The following day, she anticipated walking again with physical therapy. She thanked the nurses who had been taking care of her and told them: "I think I'll go to sleep for a while". She then died peacefully in her sleep.
