Yet it comforts me to think about the idea of her having watched me from above, every step of the way.

I will be opening my 2004 Napa, a symbolic wine of courage and determination, in Jane's memory very soon and keeping the empty bottle on my memento shelf. For the world is emptier because you're gone, but my world is fuller because you lived.
