John R. "Buddy" Musick, 85, of Spring, Texas passed away on February 8, 2023. Buddy was born on March 1, 1937 in Houston, Texas to Charles Riley Musick and Margaret Louise Massey Musick. He graduated from Lamar High School in 1955. Buddy was a native Houstonian.

Buddy served his country honorably in the Army Security Agency of the United States Army. He was stationed stateside in CA, AZ and MA and overseas in Sinop, Turkey and on the Island of Okinawa, Japan.

Buddy's business accomplishments include management positions at several Savings & Loan Associations managing the IT departments. He owned and operated Mortgage Inspection Services and Uniglobe Ultra Travel. Buddy was preceded in death by his son, Scott Musick; brother, Charles Richard Musick; half-sister, Mary Catherine White and his children's mother, Gordeen "Deen" Musick.

He will be remembered by all as a man who was loved and lived life to the fullest. His love of cars was exhibited by the 4 Corvettes he owned in earlier years. He loved the water, whether boating down the San Jacinto River, river cruises in Europe or cruising the oceans with Suzanne and with family and friends as evidenced by their numerous cruises.
