On June 30th 1973 he married Sue Ellen Koonce and instantly had a family. In 1975 they added Christopher to the mix and moved out to Spring TX. Over the years he helped provide for the family as a plumber and then later as a CAD designer. He raised a family, saw both sons married, and gained a Grand

Daughter. "Paw Paw" might have been his favorite name.
