



Juanita Dean Stockwell Dykes

December 11, 1943 - November 3, 2024

Juanita Dean Stockwell Dykes, age 80 of Spring, Texas, was born in Baton Rouge, Louisiana on December 11, 1943, to Leon and LaVerne Stockwell. She was the eldest of four siblings and the first granddaughter on both sides. Dean graduated from Central High School and Baton Rouge Trade School. She worked as a full charge bookkeeper, starting at the LSU Bookstore, where she met Dennis Dykes while he was attending school there. Dennis and Dean married at the Baptist Student Union on the LSU campus in January 1967, and welcomed their first child, Dennis Wade Dykes, Jr. later that same year. Three years later, Wade's little sister, Dharla DeAnne Dykes joined the family. Dean continued her bookkeeping career at the LSU School of Veterinary Medicine prior to going to work for her brother, Lonnie. She worked with Lonnie at Postlethwaite & Netterville, CPAs until she retired in 1999, when she and Dennis moved to Texas.

Dean is preceded in death by her husband, Dennis W. Dykes, Sr., parents, Leon L Stockwell, Jr. and LaVerne Stockwell, her brother, Dunbar "Bo" Stockwell, sister, Jeanie Valentine, brother-in-law, Michael Valentine, and niece, Jennifer Lynn Valentine.

During their life together, Dennis and Dean's brood grew. She is survived by her children, Wade and Andrea Dykes, and Joey and DeAnne Puente, grandchildren: James and Brittany Paiz, Chase Dykes, Joey Puente IV,

Maddie Puente, and Cedric and Carmen Nacua, and great grandbaby, Canaan Crew Nacua (with whom she was able to spend the last few precious months). There is also a host of friends who have been “adopted” into the family through the years, as Dennis and Dean both had a gift for welcoming others into their fold.

A memorial service for Juanita Dean Stockwell Dykes will be held Saturday, November 9, 2024, at 2 pm in Tomball, Texas at Faith Tabernacle, Reverend Keith Green officiating.
