Sharon Cabbell Roy was born February 4, 1942, in Randolph Field Station, San Antonio, TX and passed away on November 5, 2022, at Spring Creek Village, a Memory Care facility, in Houston, TX.

She attended elementary and junior high school in San Antonio before moving to Houston and completing high school at John H. Regan Senior High School, class of 1958. After high school, she spent 35 years in the commercial insurance business in Houston, San Antonio, Marble Falls, and Fredericksburg, TX. She was both a Certified Insurance Service Representative (CISR) & Accredited Customer Service Representative (ACSR).

Outside of her professional life, her life-long love was being a lifetime member of the Chili Appreciation Society International (CASI) for 40+ years where she was known as “Too Tall Chili”. She cooked, entertained, judged, and held leadership positions with some of her closest friends in several CASI Pods in several cities in Texas.
